GASLIGHT THEATER

Did you know that Hallowell-based **Gaslight Theater** is the oldest continuously operating community theater in Maine? That's because it still presented plays to take people's minds off the news even during the World War II years when most theaters went dark. In fact, in June 1944 when the troupe was staging IT PAYS TO ADVERTISE, a leading actor, William Wood, who had enlisted in the Navy was notified to report in 24 hours rather than the 10 days he was expecting. Founder Mabelle Tarr took over his role.

Miss Tarr had been a professional actress in New York along with Lillian Gish, Arthur Hopkins (Anthony's father), and Edward G. Robinson until an accident with an elevator injured her badly enough that she couldn't perform professionally any longer. In Maine she was part of a Women's Business group which met at the YMCA and was asked by some members to start a community theater, and so in 1937 the Augusta Players was formed. The first production was Shaw's ARMS AND THE MAN, directed by Miss Tarr and presented in the vestry of the Green Street church. A couple of years later, the Cony High School auditorium became the venue for their plays, with Sheridan's THE SCHOOL FOR SCANDAL being the first there.

It wasn't until 1980 the group began to be called Gaslight Theater, although officially it is incorporated as the Augusta Players d/b/a Gaslight Theater. In the intervening years between its founding and the name change the troupe staged plays in various locations in the general area of Maine's capital including Waterville Junior High, Gardiner High School Auditorium, Kent's Hill School Auditorium, and the now-demolished Capitol Theater in Augusta. It was in 1979 that the players moved permanently into Hallowell, where the Hallowell City Hall Auditorium became the home base.

Hallowell resident Richard Bostwick, Gaslight Theater's General Manager and member since 1980, says founder Mabelle Tarr was not only the Artistic Director but also the driving force of the original group. Described as a tall, thin woman who always wore pants, she was also the author of at least two full-length comedies that the Players produced. Bostwick says the group owes much of its longevity to her, and we owe him for all the detail about the history of Gaslight Theater, nee Augusta Players, unfortunately too much to include it all here.

In the Players' early days the group was very much a social club as well as a producer of plays for the public. They had monthly meetings which included presenting one-act plays as well as discussions of theater in general, and their activities were reported in the local newspaper social pages. In addition to the founder, Saunders Patterson and later his son, David, were a strong influence, Bostwick says, in keeping the group going in

the 1940's and 50's. The Players met at a variety of locations, but by 1941 they had an office and Club Rooms in Augusta, which they used until 1977 when the cost of heating caused them to give this up and also store collected properties in other locations.

In 1941 a touring subgroup, the *Kerosene Circuit*, was formed to take shows around central Maine in the summer. The name was a reference to the portable lighting style.

Over the years the troupe has presented a wide variety of plays and musicals. The 1940-41 season opened with THE BAT by Mary Roberts Rinehart & Avery Hopwood. In June 2014 Gaslight Theater staged this classic again, and in the audience was Charlotte Seehagen who had played the ingénue in the original production. In 1942 the Players brought to the stage the first of their three productions over the years of ARSENIC AND OLD LACE; keep in mind that they had permission to perform this play the first time six months after it opened on Broadway, where it ran for another 2-1/2 years. HARVEY is another play that is now a beloved classic that was first staged by this group when it was "new" and reprised by them in June of this year. In 1972 AUNTIE MAME was the group's 100th production (directed by South Portland's Linwood Dyer as were several of the early 70's shows), and one of the actors was Walter Guild in his debut; he is also in the upcoming PICASSO AT THE LAPIN AGILE, making him the senior active member, a span of 43 years!

Gaslight Theater has also produced two Maine premieres: LIPS TOGETHER, TEETH APART by Terrance McNally and A CHEEVER EVENING by A. R. Gurney. Since 2001 other classics besides those already mentioned have included DON'T DRINK THE WATER; BELL, BOOK AND CANDLE; MY

THREE ANGELS; BORN YESTERDAY; and THE MOUSETRAP.

The group's mission, set by founder Mabelle Tarr, is "to give members of the community a chance to be involved in theatrical productions and to add to the cultural diversity of the Capital area." For this reason, Augusta Players d/b/a Gaslight Theater formed the Kennebec Valley Art Association in 1959 (KVAA currently operates the Harlow Gallery in Hallowell), was a founding member of the Maine Council of Little Theaters in 1955, of the Organization of Performing Arts in Maine in the 1980's, and is also a founding member of the Maine Association of Community Theaters (MeACT), usually including a presentation at MeACT's Annual One-Act Play Festival in the spring. The group, says Bostwick, "has kept the mission of providing a chance for anyone to get involved in theater, but has put more emphasis on providing an evening of good entertainment."

A member of the American Association of Community Theaters (AACT) as well, Gaslight Theater has represented Maine at their New England Regional Festival with THE LAST CIGARETTE in 2003 and GASLIGHT CAFÉ, a collection of 10-minute one-acts assembled by Bostwick, in 2005.

How is the season chosen? The Board solicits suggestions from current and future directors and based on these, a play reading committee of members and public puts together a season and passes it on to the Board for discussion and approval. "The goal," Richard Bostwick says, "is to have a balanced season of 4 shows with a comedy, a musical, a drama, and a mystery or classic. Musicals and mysteries usually draw the largest audiences, with comedies and classics slightly less. New, not well-known plays do not attract large crowds but Gaslight is not deterred and continues to offer these from time to time to allow actors and directors to expand their experience."

Actors come to Hallowell from the entire Augusta/Waterville area and sometimes farther south, too many to list even a sampling here. Recent directors from the area include Juli Brooks, Mike Clements, Richard Bostwick, Linda Duarte, Bruce Hertz, Deborah Howard, Ellen Claire Lamb, Lynette Miller, and Jeralyn Shattuck.

George Dunn of Kents Hill directs the latest offering, PICASSO AT THE LAPIN AGILE, the absurdist comedy by Steve Martin, which goes up later this month at Hallowell City Auditorium. It's set in 1904 in a café in Paris with the 23-year-old arrogant and talented, but not-yet-setting-the-world-afire Picasso (Galen Hall) meeting Einstein (John Blanchette) at the bar when the scientist had not yet expounded his theory of relativity. The two "muse on the century's achievements and prospects as well as other fanciful topics." Also present are the bartender Freddy (Stephen Wallace); the waitress and Freddy's girlfriend Germaine (Marcia Gallagher); Picasso's art dealer, Sagot (Mike Clements); Suzanne (Peg Acheson), a young woman head-overheels in love with the womanizing Picasso and hurt and angry that he doesn't remember their past meeting; hardworking inventor with big dreams but little knowledge Charles Dabernow Schmendiman (Andy Tolman); abrupt old Frenchman Gaston (Walter Guild), who talks plainly and seems to care only about sex and drinking; the Countess (Nina Tilander) an attractive woman who thinks like Einstein and with whom he is infatuated; a Female Admirer (also Nina Tilander), who Picasso thinks is a fan, but maybe not; and the Visitor (Bill Haley), a singing time-traveler who adds a third dimension and point of view.

Asked what he sees in the future for this group, Bostwick responded, "Gaslight Theater is looking forward to its future as a community theater with a desire to strengthen our volunteer network and re-emphasize the social aspect of the organization. We currently perform four productions a year, mostly in the 122-seat auditorium in Hallowell City Hall and have a good and cooperative relationship with the City. There are no plans to change this, but we are looking at possibly also performing in other venues such as Johnson Hall in Gardiner and the Colonial Theater in Augusta. And, it is possible that in the future an effort like the *Kerosene Circuit* may be reborn."

Meanwhile, PICASSO AT THE LAPIN AGILE performances will be August 21-30, Friday & Saturday at 7:30, Sunday at 2.

In June Brunswick-based **Studio 48 Performing Arts & Dance Center** presented 13, a rock musical by Jason Robert Brown about young Evan Goldman, who was forced by his parents' divorce to move from NYC to Indiana just before his Bar Mitzah, and his efforts to become part of his new environment. Performances were at the Orion Performing Arts Center at Topshm Middle School, Topsham, ME. Kay Warren directed with Studio 48 founder Rebecca Beck as musical director and Jake Boyce as choreographer.

Sadly the **Boothbay Playhouse** in Boothbay, ME, has closed after 10 years of summer productions. The producers and performers had a farewell party on June 27.

The Thread Theater is an open performance project on Thursdays at The Franco Center, 46 Cedar St., Lewiston, ME, and is for anyone interested in acting, writing plays, or spectating. It appears to be similar to Portland's The Crowbait Club. The June 18 theme was "Bad Decisions." At the May 21 meeting playwright Anita Charles was voted as having the best play and Beth Chasse won for best performance. Visit the group on FB.

Actor/playwright **Brent Askari's** comedy COCKTAILS AND TRAVAILS has won the New Play Contest of the Neil Simon Festival in Utah. He is invited to a staged reading of his play in Cedar City this summer.

Dustin Tucker as Trinculo, a cook, and **Tom Ford** as Stephano, a butler, have been in THE TEMPEST this summer on the Idaho Shakespeare Festival stage. Both are, of course, familiar faces in plays at Portland Stage here in Maine. The play was staged earlier in Ohio.

Actor/director and co-founder of **AIRE** Theater **Tony Reilly** received a warm welcome from audiences in June when he returned to Portland stages after recovering from the terrible injuries suffered in the December accident that took the life of his wife and partner, Susan. First was one performance of ULYSSES FOR BEGINNERS at the Maine Irish Heritage Center, and then two sold-out performances of *The Coma Monologues* at St. Lawrence Arts Center. The latter show he wrote based on his dreams during the 3-week coma that was induced by the doctors to help healing during the time of the most extreme pain. Stacey Koloski directed.

Playwright/essayist **Hugh Aaron** of Cushing, ME, has been recognized for Drama in the Maine Literary Awards held on May 30 at SPACE Gallery in Portland.

The **Improvised Puppet Project** brought *Choose Your Own Adventure* to Mayo Street Arts in June, giving the audience the opportunity to make choices of dangers, adventures, and consequences.

An evening of one-act plays took the stage at **Denmark Arts Center**, Denmark, ME Jul. 2 & 3: IMPROMPTU by Tad Mosel, a "Pirandellian take on the life of the stage," and THE PROBLEM, a two-person play about a husband, a wife, & "a certain problem of a familial bent."

The Maine International Film Festival in Waterville July 10 – 19 presented too many screenings to be listed here. The films, ranging from those of student filmmakers to a number of shorts as well as the full-length ones, included work from locals, nationals, and other countries such as France, Argentina, Turkey, & Mexico. Subjects varied from THE EPIC OF EVEREST to PAUL TAYLOR: CREATIVE DOMAIN (dance), to TALES OF HOFFMAN, "a phantasmagoric marriage of cinema and opera." Included was the Maine premiere of TUMBLEDOWN by Portland husband and wife filmmakers Desi Van Til and Sean Mewshaw, set in Maine as "a love letter to Van Til's hometown of Farmington" and named for the western Maine mountain. Included were several films listed as Works-In-Progress, one of them being THE CONGRESSMAN written by Robert Mrazek (formerly a congressman from New York) and co-directed by Mrazek and Jared Martin, both of whom have vacation homes on Monhegan Island, where much of the film was shot in 2013, as well as in parts of mid-coast Maine. Treat Williams is the star as Charlie Winship in the title role, with Elizabeth Marvel as the islander he falls for, and other well-known names such as George Hamilton, Fritz Weaver, Josh

Mostel, & Ryan Merriman. Local actors include Dee Cooke (Martha a constituent), Doree Austin (Esther, a constituent), Scott Anthony Smith, & Timothy Ryan. I didn't make it to Waterville but nobody seems to remember my scene as the island's oldest resident, so it may have been cut (sigh).

Maine filmmaker **Kate Kaminski's** *Bluestocking Film F* estival returned to Portland with screenings at SPACE Gallery Jul. 17-18. She says that her film festival is "the only one in the world that requires films to pass the *Bechdel Test*, developed by cartoonist Alison Bechdel. To pass the test, a film has to have at least two named female characters who talk to each other about something other than men." Ms. Kaminski, who teaches film courses at USM and the Maine College of Art, started her series because of the lack of representation on screen of women's voices and stories. Films that she has produced include THE CREW, WILLARD BEACH, and A HOME FOR WOMEN, which was recently released in Augusta. Some of the best of the Bluestocking Film Festival have gone on to Massachusetts and NYC, and film activists in Sweden (the country) have given the festival an "A rating," indicating that all the films passed the Bechdel Test.

Maine native **Kyle Rankin**, now residing in California, was back in Maine in 2014 to shoot NIGHT OF THE LIVING DEB mostly in Portland, filling the streets with Zombies. The film premiered in Maine over the Memorial Day weekend in May this year, again in Hollywood, CA, on June 25, and now will be part of the UK *Film4 FrightFest* in London's West End at a Leicester Square theater in late August. The Film Fest calls it "outrageous!"

Wrapping up the **2015 PortFringe** with some additional information on some of the entries, let me say it would be impossible to cover them all, but here's a sample: BACK-TO-BACK, 2 plays, 4 directors, 8 actors, with each play done twice with different direction and concept, consisted of TWO BROTHERS by Hal Cohen, directed by him with actors Josh Cohen & Cameron Foley; TWO SISTERS by Hal Cohen directed by Meredythe Dehn Lindsey with actors Megan E. Tripalidi & Allison McCall; COCK FIGHT by Patricia Mew directed by Charlie Cole with actors Josh Brassard & Victoria Machado; and COCK FIGHT by Pat Mew directed by Stephanie Ross with actors Christopher Hoffmann & Elizabeth Freeman; stage management by Jewels Murphy. The Young Shakespeare Company presented ROMEO AND JULIET (keep in mind that every PortFringe entry was limited to one hour performance time) with 2 young women in the title roles (Ella Werner and Jane Ackerman) and directed by Gabriel Walker. In THE SHAPESHIFTER'S PARTY Lynne Cullen & Kurt Kish blended storytelling and live music to tell transgender folk tales and were called back for a 3rd performance in addition to the usual two. QUICKIE, a series of short plays about relationships, was written by Jennifer L. Reck & Anna Cranage Conathan and directed by Steph Ross with actors Josh Brassard & Mnemosyne Heileman. Pie Man Theatre Co. offered MACBETH, adapted & directed by Steph Ross with a large cast led by Josh Brassard (Macbeth), Randall Tuttle (King Ducan), Tom Call (Banquo), Tristan F. W. Rolfe (Malcolm), Steph Ross (Lady Macbeth), Chris Davis (Macduff), and Elizabeth Freeman, Angela Moline, & Victoria Stubbs as The Weird Sisters. Kevin O'Leary's THE FAIR was produced by Ellipsis Productions, directed by Andrew Hesselbart, and featured Marie Stewart Harmon (Ruth), Kelsey Anderson-Taylor (David), Ian Jones, & Candace Ellis Yorston. The Marine Mammal Communication Project offered DOLPHINEPHILIA: Inspired by the True Story of Margaret Howe Lovatt, who was the human teacher in a 1963 NASA-funded experiment to teach dolphins to speak English, with Heather Irish as Margaret, Mark Rubin, Brent Askari, Paul Haley, Christina Klein, & Shannon Campbell. The Southern Maine Workers' Center presented THE TRIANGLE FIRE AND THE WOMAN IN THE HAT, adapted from historical research & written by Harlan Baker, who also directed this story of the infamous Triangle Shirtwaist fire in 1911 NYC when 146 people, most of them young women, perished because of inhumane working conditions (including locked doors) and inadequate firefighting equipment. Heading the cast were AEA member Ruth Ann Phimister as Frances Perkins, who was inspired by this tragedy to spend a lifetime striving for better conditions for workers including her years as the first woman cabinet member during FDR's administration; Bridgette Kelly as her Guide in the afterlife; Herb Adams as NY politician Al Smith; and Jessica Labbe as activist Rose Schneiderman.

The theater community has lost **Gary Philip Schulz**, most recently of Windham, ME, where he passed away at his home on June 14. Gary loved singing and community theater and performed with Embassy Players and Portland Players. His favorite role was Tevye in FIDDLER ON THE ROOF. We offer our sympathy to his family.

Cast and Crew received the news too late for the June issue, but on May 24, the theater community lost **Linwood Dver**, who was born in Scarborough and returned after his time in NYC studying theater and dance to live in his boyhood home. On his return to Maine Linwood became involved with the newly formed Portland Lyric Theater, later renamed Lyric Music Theater. As well as teaching dance at the Three Arts Studio, he directed & choreographed many, many shows at Lyric over the years, including such diverse ones as CABARET and THE AMOROUS FLEA (based on Moliere's "School For Wives"); the most recent was OKLAHOMA in 2007. If he wasn't directing, he was designing sets, something he also did in the summer for many years at Barnstormers Theatre in Tamworth, NH. And he took his turn on stage as well with notable performances including Applegate in DAMN YANKEES and Mr. Spettigue in WHERE'S CHARLEY? at Lyric and the Villain in a melodrama with Fritzi Cohen as the Damsel in Distress on the Portland Players stage. Linwood, who at one point in his career was dubbed "Mr. Lyric," would have been 90 years old on July 16 of this year, and in the most recent years when he was not actively involved with theater he devoted much of his time to collecting theater memorabilia from many different sources in the hope of establishing an archive for those interested in doing theater research. He will be missed and many of those who worked with him over the years stood up at his memorial service to share their memories.

On July 10 the theater community lost Dominic Garvey, a native of Pennsylvania, who came to Maine after years of studying music (especially piano, as an instrumentalist and accompanist mentored by Samuel Barber), teaching, coaching, & musical directing in NYC. He had been invited by a former opera student with the idea of opening a theater here but then in 1982 he had an accident in which his leg was broken in 5 places, forcing him to stay for the winter and he fell in love with the place. For decades he directed shows at the popular Carousel Music Theater in Boothbay Harbor. He hired Maine singing actors as well as some from NY; Maine performers have included Jennifer DeDominici, Jennifer McLeod, & Matthew Ryder. In the winter he was frequently involved with Lincoln County Community Theater in Damariscotta. On July 11 Carousel Music Theater posted his passing on his FB page and also wrote, "The Carousel is open today for anyone who would like to drop by. And yes, as he would have insisted, the show will go on, and tonight's performance (as actually all our performances have always been) will be dedicated to his life and energy in creating the experience that we are honored to carry on each evening."

And the theater community has also lost **Betty Longbottom**, who left us on July 24. Betty performed, frequently in musical theater, at Portland Players, Lyric Music Theater, and many other New England venues in a variety of shows that included NUNSENSE, FUNNY GIRL, and SWEENEY TODD. We offer our sympathy to her family and friends.
