RIVER COMPANY CELEBRATES 20 YEARS

In the late 1990's Charles Waterman approached three other Damariscotta area actor friends he had worked with and suggested forming their own theater company. And so River Company (well, the Damariscotta River has_flowed close by every venue they've performed in) was born, with charter members Charlie, Andrea Handel, Tom Handel, and Ellen Erickson (Whalley). A few days ago I met with two of those founding members, Andrea and Tom, in Portland to talk about the beginnings and the journey of this small company.

C & *C*: *Please tell me how it all began.*

Tom: "We had all worked together at Gallery Theater in the Round Top Center for the Arts in Damariscotta in plays like THE BALD SOPRANO. Charlie wanted to do the same sort of thing, chamber theater with small sets, performing works of major dramatists, keeping the focus on acting. Our first play was Sartre's NO EXIT in 1998 with Charlie directing and playing the butler and the other three of us as Garcin, Inez, and Estelle. Charlie asked us to each put in \$100 to cover expenses. We did that and got the show on, got back that seed money, got some pay as actors, and put the rest in the bank!"

Andrea: "We started in a conference room at the Mobius Community Center in Damariscotta. We had audiences of about 30 people, which was all we had room for. When we outgrew the Mobius and moved to the Porter Meeting Hall at the Skidompha Library we had room for about 50, and this has been the perfect place for us as a minimalist theater with the focus on storytelling and acting."

C & C: Do you have an artistic director and how do you choose your plays?

Tom: "In the beginning for a while we had a Creative Director, who was also supposed to direct plays. First it was Charlie, then Ann Foskett, who joined us soon after we started, and then me,

but that evolved into our doing things more or less by committee."

Andrea: "In January we have our annual meeting, really a party, and we talk about what plays we're interested in, who's available for directing and acting and for the technical aspect. We all read the scripts and we have a March deadline to decide. We do two productions a year, one in the summer, one in the fall. Then in December we do a fundraiser with the proceeds going to a local charity."

Tom: "We were really an actor's theater taking turns directing, but mostly interested in acting. To me it was a gift, to choose plays we wanted to do and to be in them."

C & C: Is it a problem having other theaters nearby, does it take away from your audience?

Tom: "I personally don't think so. I really believe it adds to the interest in theater because Damariscotta/Newcastle is a small area and we also draw from Waldoboro, Wiscassett, and Boothbay. I believe that if we do good shows that people like, they will come to the next one."

Andrea: "We have had a loyal following of folks in our neighborhood ever since we started. If you look at the names of people who supported us, you will see that they return every year. Also River Company really fills a niche in our local community because we're doing a very different type of theater. Heartwood and Lincoln County Community Theater put on much bigger shows with bigger casts, bigger sets and lighting effects, frequently musicals. The closest we've come to a musical was the year I put together for our December fundraiser "Celebration of Water" to raise money for a pool at the local YMCA. LCCT gave us a Thursday night at the Lincoln Theater, and I was able to line up acts of all kinds, really a variety show.

We had beautiful backgrounds projected onto the movie screen at the theater, and it was all very successful."

Tom: "As far as the other theaters are concerned, we have been in each other's plays, sometimes directed; there is a cooperation among us."

C & C: Are there some highlights that you've had in productions over the years?

Tom: "Yes, ALMOST, MAINE. I first heard of it through the Portland Stage Company *Page to Stage* series, and at the time I had never heard of John Cariani. I wrote to him and he actually emailed me the script before it was actually published and gave permission to produce it. I believe we were the first non-professional company to stage it in Maine, and I was happy to direct it. Then Ann Foskett had a friend in New Hampshire who told her to check out Ernest Thompson's new play POLITICAL SUICIDE. We contacted him, he said yes, we could do it, met with us, gave a talk at the library here during the summer, and came to a performance. So we have been very fortunate to have these two playwrights be so accessible to us!"

C & C: What do you see as the future for River Company?

Tom: "River Company was different when we started, minimalist theater, small casts, we were like a family really. We didn't audition; we said, 'Andrea can play that role, Ellen can do that one, Charlie or Ann can direct.' It was wonderful. We were invested with each other. But now that has changed. We've had some people have to leave being active for one reason or another. We have new people coming in on the board, we're changing into more of a community theater that anybody can be a part of a couple of times a year, can audition for and have the chance to be in a play. It's a wonderful way to celebrate 20 years!"

Andrea: "Another good thing is that the new people joining really get involved. We have new co-presidents Mallory Adams and Tyson Bailey, a new producer, and a new director for the opening play of our 20th season! So it has been an incredible 20 years!"

The big 20^{th} Anniversary Party will be August 20, 3-5 pm, at Savory Maine restaurant in Damariscotta. You're invited and maybe can pick up one of their specially engraved Anniversary

stemless wine glasses!

Note: In 2017 Charles Waterman retired from the River Company Board of Directors and was fervently thanked by the members and friends for his leadership in founding the company and keeping it going over the years as well as his acting talent in such roles as Gunner in THE OUTGOING TIDE in the fall of 2015 and its reprise in 2016.

And now for that opening show of the 20th season – it's Christopher Durang's VANYA AND SONIA AND MASHA AND SPIKE and will run August 4, 5, 11, & 12 at 7:30 pm and August 6 & 13 at 3 pm in the Porter Meeting Hall in the Skidompha Library in Damariscotta, ME. Allison Eddyblouin directs with stage design and technical direction by Mitchell Wellman. Judy Mcquillen is the producer. In the cast are Stephen Wallace (Vanya), Christine Tupper (Sonia), Tyson Bailey (Spike), Thalia Eddyblouin (Cassandra), Tamara Lilly (Masha), and Brittany Wallingford (Nina). Call (207) 563-8116

David LaGraffe

On June 14 this year the theater community lost suddenly and tragically **David LaGraffe**, who was taken from us by a hemorrhagic stroke. A native of Syracuse, NY, David came to Maine in 1970 to teach Philosophy at St. Francis College, which later evolved into the University of New England and the Franciscans left, taking his position with them. He stayed in Maine, teaching for more than 30 years in schools in Portland. During those years he started doing drama-based studies with the kids, which evolved into doing workshops for teachers in drama. As an actor he worked with the *Peanut Butter Readers*, a touring children's theater, whose leader, Mark Pentilescu, started the *Center for Performance Studies* and hired David to teach acting.

About this time David discovered community theater – his first play was DAMES AT SEA at Portland Players in South Portland in 1979. Later he was in JESUS CHRIST SUPERSTAR there and met Claudia Hughes. A few years later they were married on that stage at Portland Players.

David's teaching of theater evolved into setting up *Lights Up Theatreworks* and he held classes at the New Church on Stevens Avenue in Portland.

Then about 12 years ago through a student David discovered Boston's *True Story Theater*, a playback company, and was so taken with the idea that he started his own company, *Portland Playback Theatre*. He recruited actors, began rehearsals, and they all started being able to make choices while in action – living in the moment -- telling back experiences of audience members based on the theme of the evening. For years they have performed on *First Friday* in Portland, first at a church on Congress Street and now for some time at CTN5, 516 Congress Street, where last year they added a *Third Friday Series*. The company members and colleagues have honored their founder by continuing the scheduled performances believing that is what he would have wanted.

Meanwhile, we don't forget David's talent as an actor in plays with a script, like the title role in SWEENEY TODD (yes, he was a great musical performer, too), Frederick in A LITTLE NIGHT MUSIC, Tevye in FIDDLER ON THE ROOF, and in

non-musicals as well, playing Lee in TRUE WEST, for instance. And back in 1989 when the late Joe Thomas, who was Artistic Director for at least a couple of decades at Portland Players, couldn't cast a play already scheduled in the season the way he wanted – what to do? – oh, right, David and Claudia lived almost across the street, and so he had George and Martha for WHO'S AFRAID OF VIRGINIA WOOLF. David and Claudia have also played Willy and Linda Loman in DEATH OF A SALESMAN.


In recent years Claudia has spent more time with her talent as a painter than on stage, but for a number of Decembers, including the 2016 holiday season, David and Claudia teamed up in costumed staged readings of Dylan Thomas's A CHILD'S CHRISTMAS IN WALES and Truman Capote's A CHRISTMAS MEMORY, sometimes in a local church, like St. Luke's in Portland or the First Congregational Church in South Portland, but most recently at The Footlights in Falmouth

Jane Bergeron, former Artistic Director of Vintage Repertory Company in Portland but now living in Australia, wrote, "I knew David for over 25 years as a fellow actor and as a very dear personal friend. We shared several memorable and life-changing tragedies and these brought us even closer together. I admired his talent, his self-discipline, his generosity, and his playfulness. But my fondest memories of David are of performing A CHILD'S CHRISTMAS IN WALES together from 1994-2004. If I close my eyes I can see him, and I can clearly hear the sound of his voice as he begins: 'Years and years ago, when I was a boy, when there were wolves in Wales, and birds the color of red-flannel petticoats whisked past the harp-shaped hills...'

A Celebration of Life for David was held on July 15 at Portland Players. Relatives, friends, and colleagues paid tribute in song, poetry, instrumental music, brief theater scenes, and, of course, some demonstrations of how playback theater works when three very good friends told their stories about David and they were acted out by members of Portland Playback Theatre. And David's colleagues from the troupe plan to honor him and his vision by continuing to perform in the First Friday Series and the Third Friday Series, as well as with special events when requested.

We offer our sympathy to all those who have worked with David over the years and especially, of course, to Claudia and family.

Then feeling conflicted about writing it as a white person without the actual experience, she talked with friends Rosalba Breazeale, Rene Johnson, & Bridgette Kelly – all women of color – asking them how racism affected them every day. Lindsey took down their words verbatim, organized them, added stage directions, and then asked Johnson & Kelly for feedback. A series of revisions were made by Johnson and other members of TEoC, Ella Mock put them together in a script, the workshop was held, and then the performances in the park.

This year's **Opera Maine** (formerly PortOpera) chamber opera, presented at four different venues prior to the main production of LA TRAVIATA, was AN AMERICAN DREAM by Jack Perla with a libretto by Jessica Murphy Moo. First performed at the Seattle Opera in 2013, it is described as an unflinching look "at the internment of Japanese-Americans during World War II shown through the prism of Nazi Germany's contemporaneous treatment of European Jews." The story tells of two families, a Japanese couple and their daughter and an American veteran and his German-Jewish wife. In the cast were Yunlei Xie and Hidenori Inoue as Hiroko and Makoto Kobayashi with Jin-Xiang Yu as their daughter, Setsuko; and Andrew Paulson as vet Jim Crowley and Anna Bridgman as his wife, Eva. Richard Gammon directed with musical direction by Timothy Steele.

Brent Askari's play PROTECTING THE INNOCENT, originally written for The Crowbait Club, has been chosen as a finalist for the Actors Theatre of Louisville's National Ten-Minute Play Contest.
