

CIRCUS CONSERVATORY OF AMERICA COMING TO PORTLAND

Probably you saw the article last March in the Portland Press Herald announcing that the **Circus Conservatory of America** was working to open a college-level school for contemporary circus arts of the *Cirque de Soleil* type at Thompson's Point in Portland, ME. **Circus Atlantic**, the recreational program of CCA, had been offering classes since the previous summer, mainly to children, and also represented CCA at the Old Port Festival in June with performances at Monument Square and other locations in the city. In March, at the time of the PPH article, they held an open house at Portland's Reiche School for children and adults to try juggling, tumbling, and other acrobatic skills. Until now, while there have been some classes available for children in these skills, as noted, classes for adults have been very limited. CCA hopes to rectify that.

Why Portland? CCA President Peter Neilsen told the local PBS station in an interview with Jennifer Rooks on *Maine Calling* that access to transportation was one factor in the selection of Thompson's Point, which is located next to the Amtrak station and close to the Portland Jetport. And Portland is close to Montreal, "the international hub of contemporary circus."

Neilsen also said, "I see Portland becoming the creative soul of this circus entertainment business in the United States – a place where people can come and be a part of a beautiful natural setting and a really creative community, and diverse community, and be able to kind of make circus happen in a way that's really thoughtful, and then take that everywhere else in the country."

Maine is already known as the site of the **Celebration Barn** in South Paris, founded by mime-master Tony Montanaro as an international center to encourage people to create their own original theater. CB's summer workshops and residencies have long included physical theater taught by international stars like Avner Eisenberg.

Originally the hope was to open CCA in Portland in 2015, but it looks now as if it will probably not happen until the fall of 2016. In the meantime fundraising, construction, and the process of gaining degree-granting authority from the state continue.

It's a little late but I just found out about this in October. Last summer THE HOUSE OF BROKEN SHIPS, a Gothic play about the elderly and seldom seen matriarch of a grandiose house, by North Haven native Tom Emerson had its premiere on the island at Waterman's Community Center. Waterman's had received a grant from the Virginia Tolman Foundation in New York to put on a new work, which allowed the Center to offer prize money for an original script-writing competition with all submissions submitted anonymously. Emerson, an "island boy", was able to capture the small town and island atmosphere in his play. He is currently getting his Master's in maritime history at UMass Amherst. The grant also allowed the hiring of professionals like director Kappy Kilburn, whom Waterman's found through Lincoln Center's Director's Lab but who has also worked in Maine before (Penobscot Theatre, for instance). Set in the 1920's the play still has meaning for contemporary audiences as it explores issues like suicide, mental illness, and secrets.

In more Downeast news, Lubec this year was the set for QUODDY TIDES, a film set in 1870 written and directed by New York-based **Erica Fae**, who also plays the lead role of Abby, who begins an unlikely romance with a Swedish sailor (played by Antti Reini, originally from Finland). Besides Lubec other filming locations were in Jonesport and on nearby Mistake Island.
