NEW: THEATER ENSEMBLE OF COLOR

Rene Johnson was only six years old when she arrived in Maine with her family from South Africa. After graduating from Portland High School she attended Pine Manor College in Boston for a year, returning to Maine to attend the University of Southern Maine. She has performed in church choirs both in South Africa and at the AME Zion Church in Portland. While working at Pratt Abbot Cleaners and two other jobs she decided to form her own business, Domestic Goddess Cleaning. She has spent three summers at the Celebration Barn Theater and served as its resident manager. She has also been in demand as a stage manager for several local theater companies as well as on tour with theater companies from Maryland and Louisiana. Recently she decided to sell her business and work full-time as an artist. She is in the process of creating a new theater ensemble, The Theater Ensemble of Color (TTOC). Cast and Crew recently caught up with her and asked her several questions about this new company and her future plans for her theater.

What drew you to the Portland theater community?

"I was tricked by my friend Julie (Goell) into my first stage managing job. I came to audition for a part in a Carolyn Gage play, THE GODDESS TOUR, for the *Maine Playwrights Festival* in 2009. She forgot to email me when she filled the role, so I showed up at her studio on Chestnut Street. I was 24-25 and in the worst part of my stage fright at the time. It had taken me weeks prior to this to agree to audition. I was certain I was going to be terrible. When she told me she had cast it already I was in tears. I had found the courage to come and now I knew this was a sign I should stop trying to perform forever.

"Julie quickly changed tactics and asked me if I was interested in stage managing. She said that a bird had told her I was organized. I had no idea what a stage manager was. She said, "The job is fairly easy. There are seven or so steps really. 1. Keep the director (me!) and the cast from diverting from the schedule and plan. 2. Keep the cast and director organized all the time. That may mean email and phone calls outside of rehearsals, which, by the way, you would have to be at every one. Also lists for costumes, cast, set, etc. 3. KEEP US ON TIME. 4. Write down everything you think is important. That means notes I give, blocking (I'll explain that later) I give, etc. I trust you will know what I mean. 5. Make sure everyone is content and feels ready for rehearsals and shows. 6. Make sure we take feasible break time. And 7. Make sure everyone is having fun.

"To make an incredibly long story short, one of my actors got amnesia before going on stage at our last show and what had been a few hours of commitment turned into one of the best stories of my life. After hours in the hospital and getting home at 3 am I cried for about 30 minutes straight from the trauma that occurred in me. I took a shower, ate something and then went to bed with the biggest smile on my face. I was hooked."

What were your first experiences like in the theater community?

"The first time I remember performing, outside of church choir and ballet recitals, was in a production of PORGY AND BESS by the Academy of St. Martin in the Fields, presented at Merrill Auditorium in the 1993-94 season. I was 9 or 10. Merrill reached out to the local African Methodist Episcopal (AME) Zion Church family. My mother has been in that church for 67 years. I don't remember much about the ordeal. I remember someone scouting out our church and speaking with the pastor. It was explained they needed all ages, children, too. If anyone could sing, it would be a great bonus. The adults got their specific roles. Our job, the children, would be to run around the stage, playing pretty much the whole time. There was a big musical number we had to learn. I remember singing my behind off, mostly because the stage manager instructed the children, 'You don't really have to sing, just mouth the words, okay, guys?' Then off she went. It was fun, exciting. I had no idea then that I would ever want to be a professional performer, an artist."

When did you decide to form the Theater Ensemble of Color?

"I officially decided this past summer while at the Celebration Barn Theater, that I was qualified enough and so therefore should make a dream of mine into a real thing. The idea of this ensemble, or rather something like this, has been running through my blood for 10 plus years. It wasn't until about three years ago that I fully understood that I am an artist and that everything in my life up to now had been preparing me for this exact moment: for Theater Ensemble of Color.

"For 24 years Maine has been my home, a place I have been proud to tell others I was from; how magic spring seasons are, how our falls are beautiful and the perfect weather for cuddling and warm beverages; how our summers are like no other place you have ever been, ever; and how much I hate our winters.

"And for most of those 24 years those were the things I happily chose to acknowledge about where I grew up. Recently my perspective about Maine has changed. The discomfort, anger, and shame that I have felt as a person of color in Portland I finally felt comfortable being honest about – just as honest as I have always been about the lovely things.

"This ensemble was created because I am angry and frustrated. I am overwhelmed with how much my white friends don't see or know about their non-white neighbors. I am broken-hearted to see how many of my friends of color are tired of having to prove their worth in a community that refuses to embrace 'different' because Mainers aren't fond of ANYONE who is from away. I'm saddened when I hear someone say, 'I'm tired of talking about racism, can't we just get over what happened in the past?' I'm tired of having to defend my opinion that racism, like other 'isms', is not in the past.

"This ensemble was created to educate, to engage, to challenge, to embrace, to fortify my community. It was created out of an ever-evolving idea, now hopefully an ever-evolving ensemble of artists from varied backgrounds and ages; a chance for energies to consistently create with each other with the understanding that the self is the first component of ensemble."

What was the audition process and how did it differ from casting a single production?

"The major difference was that everyone was allowed to audition with whatever they wanted. They were to prepare up to 5 minutes of material and then there was a 5-minute Q & A portion. The work (mostly original but not all) they were auditioning with was supposed to be a clear enough representation of who they believe they are as an artist, a representation of what they brought to the table as one member of a whole, so to speak. There was an application to fill out and breakfasty goodness. There was no limit to number, so 26 men, women, and children auditioned. The youngest to audition is 4 years old, and she wrote her own piece called 'Mamma and Her Baby.' She performed it with her mother, who auditioned separately. Our eldest auditioner is 68.

"We held three separate callbacks. It was mandatory to make it to at least one of the three callbacks. The first two were about improv work and play. It was structured only in certain parts but was about seeing everyone on their feet immediately playing and trusting a room full of basic strangers. Our 3rd callback was an opportunity for those who wanted to perform up to 10 minutes and receive collective feedback. It was a mix, but mostly original work was presented. The entire process, over two weeks, was unbelievably amazing."

What can we expect to see from the ensemble in the coming year?

"We have auditions for our gospel choir at the end of June. We will also have auditions for FOR COLORED GIRLS WHO HAVE CONSIDERED SUICIDE/WHEN THE RAINBOW IS ENUF at the end of February. We are launching a new project called *Community Lab Project: Building Inclusive Communities One Story at a Time*. We are applying for grants, seeking a fiscal sponsor and looking for rehearsal and performance spaces. We have a 2-week summer residency planned and are in talks with local playwright of color Joshua Hughes about producing one of his original plays. Our long-term goal is non-profit status."

Is there anything you would like to add?

"I'm so excited about how excited Portland has been about this new project. I knew I had amazing friends but the overwhelming support, encouragement, and love has been wonderfully unexpected, and I am so very grateful for the opportunity to show the Portland theater community what watching for 6 years has taught me. Thank you so much for this opportunity!"

Rene Johnson's onstage resume includes THE LONELY SOLDIER, a play about the experiences and hazards of women in the military, which toured in Maine last spring sponsored by the Maine Humanities Council and others; and her one-woman show GEE!, which she started writing as an exercise to get over stage fright, then found it turned into an autobiographical confessional of sorts, and premiered it in PortFringe 2014. Everything has its season but seeing Arundel Barn Playhouse close is such a loss to live theater in Maine for thousands of people."
