## A CHAT WITH PIE MAN THEATRE COMPANY

The **Pie Man Theatre Company** made its debut at PortFringe 2015 with their production of MACBETH. The theater was cofounded by Stephanie Ross and Josh Brassard. Both of them are quite well known to audiences in the Greater Portland area. Stephanie, or Steph as she is more commonly known, received her Bachelor of Fine Arts from New York University. She trained with David Mamet, William H. Macy, Felicity Huffman, Mary McAnn, Neil Pepe, and Robert Bella at the Tony Awardwinning Atlantic Theatre Company. She has acted on stage and screen in New York and New England since 1987 and was a member of Acorn's Naked Shakespeare Ensemble from 2006 -2015. After 12 years as Drama Director in the Massabesic School System until 2014, in 2015 she was named the new Director of Musical Theater at South Portland High School, where she will be directing PIPPIN, to be performed in April 2016.

Josh Brassard was recently seen as Laertes in the Fenix Theatre Company's production of HAMLET this past summer in Deering Oaks Park in Portland. He has his Bachelor of Arts in theater and creative writing from Hampshire College in Amherst, MA. A local actor and playwright, he has performed with Lyric Music Theater, City Theater in Biddeford, Acorn Productions and Naked Shakespeare, Freeport Shakespeare

Festival, and New York Theatre Company.

Cast and Crew caught up with them between rehearsals for their upcoming production of JULIUS CAESAR, which opens March 15 at Mayo Street Arts in Portland's East Bayside neighborhood, and asked them a few questions. "Beware the Ides of March."

Why did you pick this play for production?

"We picked JULIUS CAESAR for a couple of reasons. We wanted to do a Shakespearean play in honor of the *First Folio*'s arrival at the Portland Public Library in March 2016. JULIUS CAESAR is onte of the plays contained in the Folio. That, coupled with its volatile political nature, was kind of a nobrainer in consideration of our current political climate. It is an excellent vehicle for exploring the themes of power, manipulation of the masses, self-aggrandizement, and vigilantism, to name a few."

What is your approach to this play?

"Our approach to the play is modern day. It is happening everywhere to every person in present time. Our casting is non-traditional, where typecasting according to gender is not an issue. It's not women playing men's roles or men playing women's roles ... it is a clear statement of humans playing

humans. We play in the round ... really a-round. We use every bit of Mayo Street Arts Center, taking full advantage of their recent renovations, which have created a balcony space and elevated stadium seating. Every seat has a clear view of the action.

"Our rehearsals, which also take place at Mayo Street, have been going on since the beginning of December. We rehearse between 4 to 8 hours a week over a 3-1/2 month period of time. This gives the ensemble the freedom and flexibility to work in a concentrated time, while also providing space between rehearsals to allow the work to process through the body and mind."

What are some of the highlights of what you are doing in rehearsal?

"A rehearsal highlight for me has been the discussion and dissection of every scene. Obviously our comprehension of the archaic language is of the utmost importance. If we don't know what we're saying, how can the audience? In that respect, even if the audience doesn't know the meaning of a particular word, the well-prepared actor can convey meaning through expression. So to that end, we have our concordances and other reference books at the ready! It has been quite fun discovering meaning. There is nothing like asking the actor, 'What does that mean?' and the honest answer being, 'Damned if I know' ... so we look it up."

What is your expectation of audience reaction to your production?

"Let me put it this way: My grandest hope is for the audience to walk out discussing how this tragedy could have been avoided. As a theater artist, my hope is to inspire ideas that lead to the improvement of communication. You can bet, however, that if nothing else, I hope the audience leaves the theater feeling their hard-earned money was well spent!"

Harlan Baker is an AEA actor, a director, a university adjunct lecturer in theater, a former state legislator, and a playwright whose work includes his one-man show JIMMY HIGGINS (which he has toured in Eastern & Midwestern USA), as well as a number of other plays.

[Editor's Note: Why the name Pie Man? Steph Ross explains that they chose the name to honor her late father, who had to leave school in 7<sup>th</sup> grade to support the large family, learned to bake as an apprentice at a local bakery, and in the Navy in World War II was the head baker on an aircraft carrier. After the war he became a USPS letter carrier until retirement but continued to bake pies on the side for restaurants and delivered them himself. "He didn't do it for the money but because he loved to bake and see and talk with people. He was content with what he had. The man did not complain unless he was talking about politicians. He hated the hypocrisy of politics. He taught me so much about the truth and how hard it can be to be truthful in life. These qualities of listening and speaking truthfully are the 'must haves' in creating theater. It made perfect sense to me to attempt to give my dad a tiny bit of recognition for what he did, which was to be there for his friends, live simply in graciousness, and to tell the truth."]

## More Shakespeare

There's more Shakespeare to choose from and enjoy. For instance, Acorn Productions' Naked Shakespeare continues its First Friday shows with Cupid's Arrow on Feb. 5 & 6 at 7 pm in the Ballroom at Mechanics Hall, 519 Congress St., Portland, ME (free with a suggested donation of \$10); and on Feb. 10 at 7 pm at Merrill Memorial Library in Yarmouth (free). Company member Sarah Barlow directs. There will be love scenes between Benedick & Beatrice, Bottom & Titania, Touchstone & Audrey, and the triangle of Viola, Olivia & Orsino. On Mar. 5 & 6 in the Ballroom see The Seven Deadly Sins with scenes and monologues from some of the bard's most notorious characters, including Angelo, Iago, Timon, Coriolanus, Prospero, Falstaff & Jaques. Then on Apr. 1 & 2, also in the Ballroom, the Eastcheap Tavern comes alive with Drunks and Fools such as Falstaff & cronies, the Tempest zanies, Launcelot Gobbo, the Gravediggers, & the Porter. In the summer there will be more of the Bard (details in later issues of C & C): THE COMEDY OF ERRORS (Camden Shakespeare Festival), THE TEMPEST (Heartwood Regional Theater Company in Newcastle), HENRY V and LOVE'S LABOUR'S LOST (Theater at Monmouth in repertory with other non-Shakespeare classics), the Fenix Theatre returning to Deering Oaks Park in Portland, and hopefully the return of MaineStage Shakespeare Company in Kennebunk.

The **First Folio** will be at the Portland Public Library on Congress Street from March 4 to April 2 on view under a glass case near the Lewis Gallery. It includes 36 plays and is the only source for 18 of them, including MACBETH, JULIUS CAESAR, TWELFTH NIGHT, THE TEMPEST and AS YOU LIKE IT. Without this book, compiled by John Heminge and Henry Condell, two of Shakespeare's actors, these plays might have been lost. I believe Kevin O'Leary has written a play about these two actors and that we'll hear more about it later this year.

## ACTING FAQ: NEVER FACE FACTS

"Get the knack of getting people to help you and also pitch in yourself. A little money helps, but what really gets it right is to never ... I repeat, never, under any conditions, face facts." - Ruth Gordon

This is probably the most important quote about acting I have in my rather large collection. And I, for one, listened very carefully to Ruth Gordon because she had a long, successful career spanning over 70 years. She made her film debut in 1916 (at the age of 20) and her last film was released in 1988. She wrote (along with her husband Garson Kanin) two of the best Tracy-Hepburn movies, *Adam's Rib* and *Pat and Mike*. She was one of the regulars at the famous Algonquin Round Table.

She acted, wrote and directed in radio, Broadway, film, and TV. After making a nice living in show business for more than five decades, she became a star when she won an Oscar at age 72 and said, "I can't tell you how encouraging a thing like this is." Ruth Gordon stayed a star for the rest of her life. In other words, she did it all. [Ed. Note: Oscar for Best Supporting Actress in *Rosemary's Baby*, 1968]

The advice she gives us – to "never face facts" – is very important advice for anyone who wants to have a long and prosperous career in show business. Let's examine the facts that Gordon was telling us to ignore.

We'll start with the "faux facts" (utter hogwash) that you will hear during your life in the biz. Things like "they only hire their friends," "your type doesn't get work nowadays," "don't send your picture, they only throw it in the trash," "your chances of success are microscopic," "if you're not beautiful, talented or connected – forget it," "if you do extra work, you'll never be considered for a part," "all the work has gone to Canada," "everybody sleeps their way to the top," "nobody your age is being hired these days," "it's all about getting lucky" ... etc.

My fellow actors, there are literally thousands of these "facts" floating around in show business. The people who promulgate this sort of balloon juice will be insistent that they know the "facts of life," and belligerent if you even hint that they might be misinterpreting things. You must learn not to listen. Don't get me wrong; there are also a lot of REAL facts that get bandied about. "There are 135 thousand members of SAG and only about 5 thousand make any money at all." "The average actor makes about 600 bucks a year." "It takes ten years to become an overnight success." "It's all about getting lucky." (You may have noticed that the "lucky" idea made both lists — I'll get to that.)

Again, it won't help to face these facts. It's like complaining that the rain is wet. I personally know more than a thousand actors. I have movie star friends who collect some of the biggest paychecks in the business. I know Oscar, Emmy, and Tony winners. I know actors who are totally unknown to the public and yet they can afford to buy second homes in the country. I know a lot of actors who are "worker bees" and bring home a decent paycheck year after year and though you may recognize their faces, you probably don't know their

names. I know actors who have their own theaters, produce their own films, or teach in their own studios. I know hundreds of successful actors. I also (sadly) know a lot of actors who have given up. The main difference between the successful actors I know and the "never was's" is that little trick of the mind that allowed the successful ones to ignore facts and keep pressing on.

To paraphrase the secret of success in the real estate industry – the three most important words in an acting career? "Persistence, persistence, persistence." In order to persist we must ignore everything that might convince us that persistence won't work. In other words, we must ignore "the facts."

Now, what about luck? Almost every successful actor I know pays a small tribute to luck. There is a good reason for this. It is the most accepted definition of luck which says "luck is preparation meeting opportunity."

We can see it at work in most careers. For instance, Harrison Ford (famously) took many years off to earn money as a carpenter so that he wouldn't lose his house. When he got the lucky break of being near the auditions for *American Graffiti* (installing a door), preparation met opportunity and Ford walked through that door to become a huge star 14 years after arriving in Hollywood.

That IS luck. But, without a persistence of purpose, Harrison Ford might have just installed the door and faced facts, "They only hire friends."

Do yourself a favor – take Gordon's words to heart. "Never, under any conditions, face facts."


