L/A COMMUNITY LITTLE THEATRE'S 77-YEAR JOURNEY

Recently when I was trying to decide on a subject for the February issue of Cast and Crew and knowing that Lewiston/Auburn's **Community Little Theatre** was going to be staging Arthur Miller's masterpiece THE CRUCIBLE, I realized that we hadn't done a full article on the group since 2003. And that one didn't include much of CLT's history. So I asked Mitch Thomas for help. I first met Mitch back in 1985 – I can't believe that date so looked it up to be sure – when I went to Auburn to see friends in SOMETHING'S AFOOT and we went out to eat afterwards. Mitch had played Geoffrey, the young man who falls in love with the ingénue in this musical spoof of an Agatha Christie mystery. Since then he has been a frequent presence with CLT, sometimes as an actor/singer, sometimes as a director, but always as a supporter.

Mitch wrote back to me, "This past fall L/A Community Little Theatre lost a long-time, devoted member, Janet H. Gibson. The woman who authored A History of Community Little Theatre, Auburn, ME, completed in 2011, took her final bow at the age of 82. Much of the following is primarily what this remarkable woman chronicled about the company's long and distinguished seven-decade journey in the cities by the Androscoggin River in central Maine.

"In 1940, just prior to World War II, a group of friends who were active in the Taylor Pond Yacht Club decided they needed something to do after the boating season ended. These people decided it would be fun to put on a play. They convinced Eleanor McCue, the drama coach at Lewiston High School, to direct them. Dorothy (Bearce) Eichorn, a conservatory-trained actor, played the lead in the production and became the guiding light for the new group.

"The very first full-length play was LADIES OF THE JURY and the date was May 19, 1941. It was presented for invited friends at the Edward Little High School Auditorium in Auburn – the same stage where Community Little Theatre performs today at the Great Falls Performing Arts Center!

"There were close to 50 charter members for the new organization. Members would have Saturday parties, and often the next production was from those who attended these soirces. Those gathered had lots of fun and they really weren't too serious about the organization's future at that time. However, with 76 seasons behind it and the 77th well under way now, things obviously got pretty serious.

"Founder Dorothy Eichorn left her mark on the theater when she organized the group, and she continued to perform in the productions for many years. She was present for and spoke at CLT's 60th Anniversary Revue in 2000. Eleanor McCue was the primary director throughout the first decade. As time went on, new directors stepped forward and directed the plays.

"It took more than 15 years before CLT decided to produce its first musical. Sources say that many active members were opposed to the idea, feeling CLT could never pull it off, it would be too costly, and no one would come. Once it was determined that it was not feasible for the Edward Little High School Band to provide the accompaniment for a musical, they began to look for a piano player.

"At the time, Bert and Connie Cote were well known for their local radio program. After a great deal of research, the popular Broadway musical KISS ME KATE was chosen. Bert and Connie (who still does her own French-language radio show every Sunday on Maine's Big Z-105.5) served as the first 'pit band' playing piano and organ. Connie also became the first music director, and this was the beginning of the big musical productions that have made CLT proud for over 60 years."

Thank you, Mitch, and Janet, of course, for that history background. I didn't know any of that before. Mitch, now please tell us more about the sort of show the group has produced over the years.

"Community Little Theatre has produced such blockbuster musicals as EVITA, FOOTLOOSE, GREASE, A CHRISTMAS CAROL The Musical, THE FULL MONTY, JEKYLL AND HYDE, CINDERELLA, AIDA, SPAMALOT, HAIRSPRAY, THE ADDAMS FAMILY, Disney's BEAUTY AND THE BEAST, and every imaginable standard 'chestnut', including a revival of KISS ME, KATE and this season's sold-out CHICAGO.

"For the past 50 seasons the company has followed a formula of doing 3 musicals and 2 straight plays each season. Some of the straight shows were very well known, and from the beginning have included some that were edgy and even risky for their box office appeal. CLT has never shied away from presenting dramas and comedies that had great artistic value and offered meaningful acting experience for its members. More recent shows in that category include THE LARAMIE PROJECT, A SHAYNA MAIDEL, AUGUST: OSAGE COUNTY, and the current production of THE CRUCIBLE. The rest of the 77th season includes PRELUDE TO A KISS and the musicals GYPSY and SHREK The Musical."

What about the next generation of theater people?

"For the past four decades, Community Little Theatre has also provided opportunities (predominantly in the summers) for young children and teens to participate in full-scale musical productions on the main stage. As adults, many of the young thespians have continued to participate on and off stage in CLT shows, in other theater companies' productions across the country, in regional professional theaters, in Broadway productions in New York and on tour, as television actors and producers (including Adam Barr of WILL AND GRACE), as school drama coaches and production directors, and as artistic directors and technical professionals for a variety of arts programs throughout the world."

It would be impossible to list all those who have left their mark on CLT over the years in one capacity or another. Just a few names that come to mind in addition to Mitch include the late Mary Glenn Rosenberg, Linda Britt and Stan Spilecki, Richard Martin, David Lock, Dick and Carole Rosenberg, Eileen Messina, Paul G. Caron, Roger and Celeste Philippon, and many more.

THE CRUCIBLE will run from Feb. 3 - 12, Fri-Sat. & Thurs. Feb. 9 at 7:30, Sun. at 2. Kay Warren directs assisted by Jason

Pelletier. The production team includes Glenn Thibault (set builder), Jessica Henson (set decorator), Brandon Chaloux (props master), Cody Watson (stage manager), and Nicole Chase (producer). The large cast includes Stephen Brakey (John Proctor), Rebecca Cole (Elizabeth Proctor), Emily Grotz (Abigail Williams), Mackenzie Richards (Mary Warren), Amy Cote (Betty Parris), Sean Wallace (Rev. Parris), Paul Menezes (Rev. Hale), Mark Hazard (Deputy Governor Danforth), Charlie Cole (Judge Hathorne), Phil Vampatella (Francis Nurse), and Megan Guynes (Tituba).

JULIE GOELL

Our local theater community and the international theater community as well have lost **Julie Goell**, who left us on December 11, 2016, after a long battle with multiple system atrophy, a neurodegenerative condition. The illness first became apparent in 2010 when she lost her balance while performing and said she felt "out of whack" on stage. This was sad news indeed for someone who was widely known as a physical comedian, mime, and clown.

Michael Levine, Artistic Director of Acorn Productions, said that day, "I was saddened to hear of the loss of Julie Goell. She was one of the first performers that I hired at Oak Street Theater in 1994, and she and (her husband) Avner Eisenberg helped bring *Phyzgig* to the Portland community for 15 years. (*Phyzgig* was a program of vaude-ville and physical comedy which was performed between Christmas and New Year's, mostly at Portland Stage Company's theater, but at some other venues as well.) She had so many talents: mask making, performing, teaching, but most of all her sense of humor and bound-less energy for creation."

My own experience with Julie started with seeing her at Oak Street in 1994 in WOMAN IN A SUITCASE and continued over the years with her directing me in a couple of plays and then my being accompanist for Julie's *Maine Opera Atelier* (Julie loved opera), which she ran and directed for several years, bringing music programs to such locations as The Atrium at Cedars, Ocean View in Falmouth, and a Peaks Island church. It was a privilege to work with her.

Born in Brooklyn in 1951, Julie spent most of her youth in Rome, Italy, where she learned miming and clowning, and even completed teacher training in physical theater. While living in Europe she performed in theater, film, and TV and toured as a clown, including a year on the road with a Swiss circus, and toured her own live jazz show. Julie got her degree in theater from Emerson College in Boston, and later she studied string bass and voice at the University of Southern Maine, and for some years, until her illness prevented her, she toured both in the U.S. and in Europe with the Casco Bay Tummlers, a klezmer band.

Actor and musician Nancy Hoffman, a member of the Casco Bay Tummlers, says, "Julie was a friend, sister, talent, inspiration, comic, musician, mother, wife, confidante, crusader, and a light on the planet."

Avner Eisenberg and Julie Goell met in 1970 when she was at Emerson and he was at NYU and Julie went to NY with her mime teacher for a series of workshops and lectures -- Avner was assigned as her liaison. Fifteen years later they met again in Florida when he was visiting friends after filming JEWEL OF THE NILE and Julie was directing *commedia dell'arte* for Disney World's Epcot Center. As they fell in love and became serious, he invited her to visit him at his home on Peaks Island in Maine, and that's where they lived for 30 years and brought up their son, Zev Eisenberg, who now lives in Boston.

Together Julie and Avner taught *Eccentric Performing* at the Celebration Barn in South Paris, ME, for 25 years until 2016. Julie has acted on Broadway and has directed in NY and California, as well as Florida and Maine, and has taught physical comedy and *commedia dell'arte* at Boston University, Colby College, UConn and the Spoleto Festival. One of Julie's most popular stage offerings was her onewoman show *The MOPera*, in which she plays the cleaning lady at the opera house as well as other characters, including the conductor, using the cleaning lady's tools as props.

As Julie's illness progressed, gradually taking away her ability to walk and eventually even speak, she never lost her humor or her indomitable spirit. A team of island friends were caregivers as well as her husband, and one of them would give her a word and she would

"write" haiku verses, even when she had to point to the letters to make up the words. The verses were often posted on Facebook. Before that while she could still speak, Julie dictated to her island friends her book Life In a Clown House: A Manual and a Memoir. They took down the words for her how-to-guide to clowning and her stories, assembled them, and oversaw the publication, which took place last spring. The book is available on Amazon.

In January 2017 in honor of the performer/teacher, Avner Eisenberg and the Celebration Barn established *The Julie Goell Fund for Eccentric Women* to support training and professional development for emerging and professional women clowns. The script has been created from a literal translation by Columbia University Professor Ronald Meyer. Artistic Director Al D'Andrea says, "Our mission is to present new

works of cultural, ethical, and spiritual value, and our adaptation of Chekhov's timeless play will resonate strongly with our community of Mainers. In this rendering (of the play) we explore themes of mom and pop business versus corporate takeover, the changing economy, immigrants assimilating into society, damaging provincialism in small towns, tenant farmers, homelessness, and the desire to escape from challenging, even tragic events in our lives – all seasoned with Chekhov's characteristic humor as well."

The **Royal River Community Theatre** presented THE JUNGLE BOOK in January at the First Parish Congregational Church in Yarmouth, ME.

In December Michael Donahue organized a reading of Shaw's MAJOR BARBARA at the **Blue Hill Public Library**, Blue Hill, ME. FMI on future play readings at the library call Michael at (207) 374-5248 or the library at (207) 374-5515.

Also in December, there were two performances of AN EVENING OF LONGFELLOW AND DICKENS, A Theatrical Conversation, at the **Maine Historical Society** in Portland. This scripted program that includes excerpts from the works of the Maine poet and the English author was first performed the previous winter as requested by MHS. Actors were Daniel Noel, playwright of LONGFELLOW: A LIFE IN WORDS that was performed at Portland Stage's Studio Theater in 2007, and Andrew Harris, who has presented the character of Dickens, touring around the state with IN THE COMPANY OF DICKENS.

Identical twins **Sara and Leigh-Ann Esty** from Gorham, Me, started studying dance together at age 3, then at Maine State Ballet School, leaving after high school for Florida, where they apprenticed at the Miami City Ballet School and then danced with the company for 9 years. In 2014 their paths diverged when Sara was chosen from nearly 2,000 dancers for the Broadway-bound musical AN AMERICAN IN PARIS and then took over the lead role of Lise for the national tour. At that point when the director said, "I wish we could clone you," Sara replied, "Funny you should say that," and produced her identical twin for an audition. Now together in the same company, Leigh-Ann performs Lise at Sunday matinees and is in the ensemble the rest of the time.

In more news about former Mainers and what they're doing now, **Ralph and Marion Barnes**, who were charter members of Lyric Music Theater (originated as Portland Lyric Theater), performed in shows here for a number of years before moving to the Boston area, and eventually wound up summering in Maine and spending the rest of the year in Florida, are still involved in theater in the Sunshine state. They co-directed Norm Foster's OFFICE HOURS, which opened in January and continues through Feb. 12 at the Lemon Bay Playhouse.

And remember Mark Mannette, a Windham native who acted and directed here and had his own company PortStar Productions? Following a career path from Maine to Minnesota to Florida, and eventually to Kansas, where he heads the theater department at Newman University, he also still acts and directs elsewhere, including directing at Shakespeare in the Valley in New Hampshire last summer. Currently in Kansas he recently played Dr. Rank in A DOLL'S HOUSE at Newman U. and in mid-January was one of three performers at the Wichita Orpheum Theater in HOME ON THE RANGE: The Story of American Song.

Portland native **Linda Lavin**, who starred on TV as ALICE and whose Broadway performances have included winning a Tony for her role in Neil Simon's BROADWAY BOUND, in January was performing in the New York City Opera revival of Leonard Bernstein's CANDIDE directed by Harold Prince. Her role? The Old Lady, about which a reviewer said, "The splendid actress Linda Lavin stole every scene she was in as an Old Lady with harrowing life tales to tell."

Actor/director/teacher **Michael Howard** (AKA Charles Michael Howard, AEA actor) after many years here in Maine has returned to his native Texas. It was in March 2015 that Michael lost his beloved wife, Carol, to cancer. After a six-month period of mourning he did agree to continue with plans to play the title role in Kevin O'Leary's production of KING LEAR and this was the crowning achievement of his theater career in Maine, with performances in Portland last May. His many appearances on Maine stages (and on film) also included roles with Good Theater (AUGUST: OSAGE COUNTY), American Irish Repertory Ensemble (SOMEONE WHO'LL WATCH OVER ME), Freeport Shakespeare Festival (TWELFTH NIGHT), The Originals (ABUNDANCE), Acorn Productions' Naked Shakespeare, & Portland Stage Company, among many others.

The prolific playwright **Delvyn Case, Jr.,** who has had several of his plays selected for presenting by the Maine Playwrights Festival in Portland, often featuring stories from Africa or the Middle East, saw another of his works staged on Christmas Eve at First Lutheran Church in Portland: THE SHEPHERD'S STORY with Nancy Houlihan as the shepherd.

The theater community has lost **Lynne LeSuer**, who left us in November. She is remembered by fellow cast members from shows at L/A Community Little Theatre in Auburn, especially for performing in A Christmas Carol The Musical. We offer our sympathy to those who loved her.

We have also lost two other L/A Community Little Theatre members. **Pat Schnitzer** left us in October. She was recognized at CLT's 75th Anniversary Gala for her lifetime's work as Costume Chair and Costumer Extraordinaire. It is said that some people know the history of CLT the organization, but Pat knew the history of CLT's costumes and could probably tell you a particular costume's entire pedigree!

Then in December we lost **Janet Gibson**, who was CLT's Box Office Manager and Season Ticket Coordinator for a number of years as well as being CLT's Historian. She appeared on stage as an actor in numerous productions as well. We also offer our sympathy to those who loved and worked with these ladies.

And **Bruce Avery** left us in December when he lost his battle with Multiple System Atrophy-Cerebellum. Bruce taught, acted in, and directed plays at Gorham High School and for many years at the Schoolhouse Arts Center in Standish (where his wife, Eileen, also usually directed teens in Shakespeare plays in the summer). For years Bruce directed a summer musical at the Schoolhouse, with the most recent being THE SOUND OF MUSIC in 2012, THE MUSIC MAN in 2013, FIDDLER ON THE ROOF in 2014, and ALICE IN WONDERLAND JR. in May of 2015. We offer our sympathy to Eileen and family and all those who enjoyed working with Bruce over the years.
