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PortFringe Festival 2017 by Muriel Kenderdine

You're invited to check out Maine's own Fringe Festival, PortFringe, eight days and 125 performances at various venues from June 17 through 24. This is the sixth annual celebration of performing arts in Portland since it was founded in 2012 and continues to be run entirely by volunteers. Last year's PortFringe generated \$30,000 in ticket sales, all funneled directly back to the artists.

For new subscribers and anyone who needs a quick reminder on what is Fringe, it started in Edinburgh, Scotland, when theater people decided to have an alternative festival playing concurrently with the Edinburgh International Festival. The next year a local newspaperman gave it a name: "Round the fringe of official Festival drama, there seems to be more private enterprise than before ... " From there it has spread around the world, and now the USA hosts more Fringe Festivals than any other country. And Portland's has been a successful one, growing and expanding each year.

Founding PortFringe committee member Mariah Bergeron says, "The festival showcases an enormous number of local and national performances, hidden in rock clubs, tiny stages, and historic buildings. Plus, all the proceeds go back to the artists, which is relatively unheard of. At a time when it's harder and harder for artists to afford to create experimental work, we're providing an accessible platform specifically for challenging or non-mainstream performance. We encourage grit, risk, and sweat - because this isn't theater, it's Fringe."

This year's lineup includes original plays, experimental works, multimedia performances, dance, comedy, and musical theater. All shows are one hour or less and start times are staggered, encouraging attendees to view as much as possible. Venues, all in the Arts District, are Portland Stage Studio and Storefront (25A Forest Ave); Geno's Rock Club (625 Congress St); Empire (575 Congress St); Bright Star World Dance (108 High St); and Mechanics Hall (519 Congress St). PortFringe Central is located on street level at Portland Stage.

Portland Stage Company introduced three new full-length plays in its Little Festival of the Unexpected in May - two of them are committed to being produced in the spring of PSC's 2017-18 season. One is SEX AND OTHER DISTURBANCES by Marisa Smith, a comedy about a rich woman "who starts an affair to escape her husband's constant fretting about the collapse of Western civilization." The other is THE NICETIES by Eleanor Burgess, a two-person drama about Zoe, a biracial student, and Janine, her white professor, whose differing views about slavery and the American Revolution clash. The third play, Bess Welden's REFUGE/MALJA with translation by Ali Al-Mshakheel, will go on to a workshop production. It is the story of Jamie, a Jewish-American photojournalist "who calls up an old friend, Ibrahim, in the middle of the night to discuss translating a message into Arabic. What she hesitates to tell Ibrahim is that the message is for a young Syrian refugee she's met who just might be the son she never had - or the grandfather she never knew - in this decadespanning drama about the refuge we all search for."

PSC's April production of STRING AROUND MY FINGER by Brenda Withers was directed by Sally Wood with scenic design by Anita Stewart, lighting by Bryon Winn, costumes by Loren Shaw, sound by Karin Graybash, & stage management by Shane Van Vliet. In the cast were Chris Davis (Kip) & Marjolaine Whittlesey (Emma) as the young couple whose wedding plans are put on hold by the unfortunate medical emergency of a miscarriage; Dave Mason (Dave, a somewhat sarcastic and blasé nurse, who turns out to have a softer side); Danielle Slavick (Lisa, Kip's sister who tries to manage solutions for everybody); & Lisa Stathoplos (Mrs. Rizzo, an offbeat wheelchair-bound sage). The May production of DISGRACED by Ayad Akhbar was directed by Christopher Grabowski with scenic design by Anita Stewart, lighting by Cecilia Durbin, costumes by Kenisha Kelly, sound by Barbara Truex, & stage management by Myles C. Hatch. Actors were Alex Purcell (Amir, a corporate lawyer), Roya Shanks (his wife, Emily, an artist), Jonas Cohen (Isaac, gallery owner), Robin Payne (Jory, Isaac's wife, who works with Amir), & Salar Ardebili (Abe, Amir's nephew). "Amir, a rising star in a highpowered New York law firm, has distanced himself from his Muslim roots in a bid for success. When he and his wife, Emily, host an Upper East Side dinner party, what starts as a friendly conversation escalates, upending their views on race, religion, and each other." There was a special Discussion Series open to the public during the run of the play, examining the price paid to live the American Dream.

On May 13 at the Abyssinian Meeting House in Portland, ME, **Rene Johnson** presented her original one-woman show *GEE*! along with a workshop exploring with the audience what collective community activism can generate and what to do with the new energy.

A mysterious artwork created in a corporate parking lot reveals legacies of Viet Nam, love lost, & family secrets.
