RETURN OF A KING

In the spring of 1991 James Noel Hoban inaugurated his American Renaissance Theater with performances of Shakespeare's tragedy RICHARD II at the Wherehouse, a chem-free night club located at the time in a storefront on Forest Avenue in Portland in the same building which houses Portland Stage Company. Hoban, a native of NYC who was still in his 20's, had trained at SUNY-Purchase and with the National Theatre of Great Britain before moving to Maine. An accomplished Equity actor who has since performed with Portland Stage Company, Good Theater, Theater at Monmouth, and Dramatic Repertory Company, he was bitten by the directing bug while still in college; so he directed this inaugural RICHARD II and also played the title role.

Saying, "The heritage of Shakespeare is our heritage," his goal at the time was to present all of the War of the Roses history plays over the next few years, and he succeeded in producing all of them (sometimes directing, sometimes acting, and sometimes with guest directors) except the 3-part HENRY VI, which defies attempts to integrate it into a viable evening's performance. After HENRY IV Parts 1 and 2 at the Wherehouse, HENRY V and RICHARD III were staged at Oak Street Theater, there was HAMLET at Portland Stage, and then Chekhov's THE CHERRY ORCHARD back at Oak Street. By 1996, however, running the whole theater by himself became too burdensome apparently and James shut down his ART and devoted more time to his own acting career in film and with other theaters, including those mentioned above.

Now he has founded the **Portland Shakespeare Company**, which sees the return of RICHARD II with performances March 31 – April 10 at Portland's St. Luke's Cathedral. He said recently, "I've wanted to revisit this play for some time now and the Shakespeare *First Folio* tour seems the perfect occasion to do so. It's a unique play in the canon, one of only two written entirely in verse, and while it is a very lyrical and somewhat elevated piece, it also deals with the stark and brutal realities of politics, religion and dynasty in a way that is entirely accessible to the modern audience."

Since Richard, monarch from childhood, believes himself to be God's anointed ruler of England, the background of a church setting seems appropriate. Unfortunately his vanity and misrule set in motion the War of the Roses. Hoban directs the play, which coincides with the culmination of the hosting by the Portland Public Library of an original 1623 edition of Shakespeare's *First Folio* from March 4 – April 2. RICHARD II is being presented in its historical period and used a First Folio facsimile text with original spelling and formatting as rehearsal script. Playing the title role will be Equity actor **Ian Carlsen**, who has performed with other theaters including Portland Stage, Lorem Ipsum, Good Theater, and Dramatic Rep.

Hoban said, "This really is a perfect combination of actor and role in my opinion. There is in Richard a kind of self-awareness and psychological complexity that is akin to Hamlet in many ways, and I know Ian is going to give us a rich and entirely compelling portrayal."



KING LEAR AS PRODUCED IN SHAKESPEARE'S TIME

Wait! What? No women in the cast? How can that be?

Kevin O'Leary replies, "It all began when Michael Howard and I attended the performances of Mark Rylance's all-male company of RICHARD III and TWELFTH NIGHT on the same day back in December of 2013. Spellbound, we watched the work performed in front of us, especially the work of the male actors in the female roles. What struck both of us was the ability these great actors had in mining the depths of their characters, regardless of their gender -- what must it feel like to perform in a single-gender cast as was done originally by Shakespeare's players? We left the theater that night asking one another: Could a theater company of men in Portland, Maine, do the same – honor the journey of those female characters with a likeminded original practices production of similar spirit?

"In January 2014 Michael and I gathered a few close friends at the home of Daniel Burson to read KING LEAR. All agreed at the end of the evening that a full production would be a once-in-a-lifetime opportunity for us as men to discover as Shake-speare's company did 400 years ago: What is it to be male? What is it to be female? And what is it to accept both into the fabric of our being as players on a stage and as men? We agreed to give it a go in the spring.

"Then tragedy struck. Michael's beloved wife, Carol, passed away and the project needed to be delayed. After a six-month period of mourning, Michael informed his friends that he was once again ready to reconsider playing the role of Lear. The company realized that by postponing the run until 2016, we would be coinciding with and commemorating the 400th anniversary of Shakespeare's death. As it happens the announcement of our all-male Lear to the public came at the same time that Bare Bard (now Bare Portland) announced an all-female MACBETH and the UK's Donmar Warehouse's all-female

production of KING HENRY IV is playing to sold-out houses in Brooklyn, NY."

But why did you choose this particular play, Kevin?

"Michael and I truly believe that LEAR is Shakespeare's greatest tragedy and by extension his greatest play. It is, at its core, a play about suffering. Two members of our cast, Michael Howard and Tony Reilly, have suffered greatly of late, as you know. And our dear friend, Keith Powell Beyland, has been going through his share of suffering, too. Michael and I wanted to crack open this huge play with these good men to, well, to suffer together that we might triumph over suffering in the end."

How did you cast the play? Did you do it or did Director **Daniel Burson**?

"Michael and I suggested some casting, but the majority of the casting was Daniel's choice. It was a tough selection I can tell you. There are so many good men in our community. Dan also had a concept: the two elder actors, then the mid-range actors, and then the younger actors, and he is playing up the generations with our nine men."

Those in the cast, in addition to Michael Howard as Lear, Tony Reilly as Gloucester, and Kevin O'Leary as the Fool, are Rob Cameron as Regan, Peter Brown as Goneril, Ian Carlsen as Cordelia (and Edmund), Mark Rubin as Albany, Corey Gagne as Kent, and JP Guimont as Edgar. Have you had personal work experience with them?

"I truly feel that these men selected are eight of the finest actors in our midst. I have either acted with, been directed by, or written for all of them save two. But I would pay top dollar to see any of them any day of the week!"

Is this KING LEAR a one-time offering or do you plan on more in the future – maybe something with women?

"This production is a one and done. Equity has a special contract permitting union actors to put on a production (with severe restrictions) because it now accepts that there are many areas in the United States where there are many union members but few union houses in which they may act. So, Equity says to their people, 'Here is this opportunity, but the opportunity cannot be taken for granted.' We have five Equity actors in the Lear cast."

Lanyard Theatre produced only original plays, basically by members of your WritersGroup. Although it was relaunched briefly several years go with Joe Barbarino and Elizabeth Lardie directing your play LASCAUX, was Lanyard discontinued because your co-founder John Upham withdrew and it was too much for one person, you, to carry alone with everything else that you do?

"I loved Lanyard, and it was hard to say goodbye to my company. But I got tired, as so many do, of hitting up the same people, mostly family members, for money. You can only go to that till so many times, and then people stop answering the phone. I don't mind producing with my investors every once in a while (for Lear, for example) and my investors are producing my new play THE ROLES OF A LIFETIME, in No-

vember with Michael Howard directing, starring Rob Cameron, JP Guimont, and Corey Gagne, but I just don't want to do it continuously. It is exhausting. But KO will pop up every now and then in the future."


Is there anything else you would like to add?

"I would like to say what an honor it is to be in such talented company with the Lear boys. And this being the 400th anniversary of the Bard's death, our all-male company wanted to pay homage to the original practice of performing with an all-male company of players. I was also very excited to see Bare Portland's all-female cast of MACBETH. I'm still kicking myself for not getting down to New York to see the all-female HENRY IV. I heard great things about that production with all women in all the roles. It's just such an exciting time for actors doing Shakespeare. With the world the way it is now, we need Shakespeare more than ever. He invented us and he will save us...from ourselves."

KING LEAR will be performed at the Portland Ballet Studio Theater, 517 Forest Ave. in Portland. Curtain time is 7:30 pm on May 19-21 & May 25-27; two shows on May 22 will be at 2:30 & 7:30. No reservations – all seats are first come, first served. For tickets (only 74 seats), \$20 each, it's best to arrive by 7:10 pm.
