YEAR TWO: STUDIO REP AT PORTLAND STAGE

You'll have to hurry, if you haven't already seen at least one of the offerings, to catch the second year of **Portland Stage's** *Studio Rep* season, which opened about a month earlier in 2014 than last year, running January 9 through February 2. The three plays performed in repertory are THE BROWN CLOUDS OF COURAGE: The Musical; ACT ONE, SCENE TWO; and TEMPORARY LIVING ARRANGEMENTS. All the productions have never been seen before.

Monday Tuesday Wednesday Thursday Friday Saturday Sunday Theatre Company (MTWTFSS) presents THE BROWN CLOUDS OF COURAGE: The Musical by Philip Hobby, Nathan Speckman, and Johnny Speckman, who also directs. The play tells the story of three couples, each wrestling "with unique and absurd challenges in their relationships." In the cast are Philip Hobby, Marie Stewart, Kyle Robert Dennis, Kat Moraros, Jessica Fratus, Jake Cote, and Joanna Clarke. Musical direction is by Bernard Chumley and stage management by Scott Leland. Previous offerings of this company include MR. MARMALADE in the 2013 Portland Fringe Festival and later as a special event at Mad Horse Theatre in South Portland. The final performance of THE BROWN CLOUDS OF COURAGE is February 2 at 3 pm. The Improvised Puppet Project, based in Westbrook, ME, with ACT ONE, SCENE TWO starts "with the first scene of a brandnew play, then throw(s) the script out the window and improvises(s) the rest. Theater doesn't get any more live than this." The idea for this project was first developed by San Francisco's Un-Scripted Theater Company. This is the East Coast premiere. IPP's offering starts with plays by Brent Askari (BAD, BAD GIRLS), Linda Britt (THE GIRL IN THE RED HAT), Carolyn Gage (ON THE OTHER HAND), Elizabeth Guffey (ALIEN AUTOPSY), Michael Kimball (BAR EXAM), Dana Pearson (THE MAIN COURSE), and Karmo Sanders (REVENGE OR

SACAJAWEA). The actors (in addition to more than a dozen puppets) are Keith Anctil, Tara McDonough, and Jen Whitley. Live musical scoring is by Jon Andrews, and lighting cues are created on the fly by technical director Patrick Ledwith. The final show this weekend will open with Linda Britt's THE GIRL IN THE RED HAT on February 1 at 3 pm. The IPP is also on Facebook.

Lanyard Theatre Company's play is TEMPORARY LIVING ARRANGEMENTS by Elizabeth Lardie, directed by Joseph Barbarino, and considers that "Death is no laughing matter ... unless it's the only thing left to do." Lanyard Theatre, founded in 2005 by Kevin O'Leary to support the production of new plays, originated in the Trigorin Project in Bath, ME, when high school writers and actors were placed with professional mentors from Maine and New York to present new works. In Ms. Lardie's dark comedy she herself plays the part of Ollie, an editor and the obituary writer of a fictional mid-coast newspaper, whose mother is dying of cancer. Others in the cast are Keith Powell Beyland as Elliot, her boss, Matthew Delamater and Colin Kelley as her fellow newspaper editors Ezra and Martin, respectively; Kerry Rasor as her mother, Avril; Benjamin S. Row as the funeral home assistant, Jeremy; Michael Tooher as Jack Grace, the neighborhood "guardian angel"; and Karen Ball as the hospice nurse. The final performance will be February 1 at 8 pm. Midcoast Actors' Studio

My dream since I was a teenager has always been to start my own theater company," says Jason Bannister. "I started a group with some high school friends in Lewiston back in the mid 90's."

And now, roughly 20 years later, he has done it again with **Midcoast Actors' Studio**, which he founded in the winter of 2012 with an ensemble of other ardent actors and theater technicians who had first worked with him a year before in December 2011. That first production was none other than Ibsen's HEDDA GABLER, not exactly the easiest play to inaugurate a new company. However, it was so successful in its performances on the stage at Troy Howard Middle School in Belfast and at the Camden Public Library that it was followed by Strindberg's MISS JULIE and G. B. Shaw's PYGMALION, both performed at Troy Howard and MISS JULIE also in Camden.

MAS Artistic Director Bannister, who lives in Searsmont and whose "day job" is teaching at Troy Howard, considers himself fortunate to be not only one of the few middle school performing arts teachers in Maine, but also because it gives him the opportunity to use the school's stage for some of his company's work. One of his aims in starting a new theater group is to present more of the classics rarely seen in the area. Since many of these are in the public domain, that also makes producing the plays less expensive for a new company operating on a shoestring budget.

In addition to his student productions, which include an annual musical such as THE MUSIC MAN, Bannister has been involved with shooting and editing movies with area performers, has directed for Northport Music Theater (GOLF:The Musical) among others, and has appeared on stage with Belfast Maskers in such roles as Marc in ART and acted in an independent production of A CHRISTMAS CAROL in Camden. It

was in CAROL that he met director and set designer John Bielenberg and his wife Elaine, who designs costumes.

In that inaugural production of HEDDA Danielle Bannister, Jason's wife and also an experienced actor, was originally set to play the title role giving the couple their first chance to be on stage together since college days, but medical issues, which she has since recovered from, caused her to step down. So Marie Merrifield became Hedda with Erik Perkins as husband Jorgan Tesman, Jason Bannister as former love Eilert Lovborg, Katie Glessner as Thea Elvsted, Christine West as Tesman's Aunt Julie, Jay Rosenberg as Judge Brack, and Amy Pillitteri as Berte, the family servant. Jason originally had planned a very simple set and maybe a modernized setting, but the Bielenbergs came on board with John's offering to design the set and Elaine the costumes.

MISS JULIE, in Penny Penniston's modernistic adaptation of this play, which deals with class, love, and power struggles between the sexes, again had Marie Merrifield in the title role with Jen Oldham and Jason Bannister in the cast, while he also directed. The smaller size and the intimacy of this production made it easier to tour.

Then in June 2013 came Shaw's PYGMALION, which I'm sure you all know was the basis for MY FAIR LADY, and which was produced in London a century ago with Mrs. Patrick Campbell, a leading English actress and Shaw's favorite of the time, as Eliza and directed by Shaw himself. For MAS Erik Perkins directed with Jason as producer, set and costume designs by the Bielenbergs, and Aspen Jones as stage manager. In the cast were James Clayton as Henry Higgins, Marie (Merrifield) Stickney as Eliza, Greg Marsanskis as Colonel Pickering, and Jay Rosenberg, Beverly Mann, Charlotte Herbold, Katie Glessner, Dana Wilson, Kieran Shell, Beth Row, Mike Rowe, and Christine West.

In September MAS presented their first contemporary play, GLENGARRY GLEN ROSS, David Mamet's exploration of the behind-the-scenes action in a real estate office. Tara Woods directed with set design this time by Jason Bannister, lighting by Jay Rosenberg, costumes and makeup by Karen Brezsnyak, props by Beth Rowe, and music design by Amy Pillitteri. In the cast, again on the Troy Howard stage, were Greg Marsanskis as Shelly Levene, Jason Bannister as Ricky Roma, Mike Rowe as George Aaronow, Erik Perkins as John Williamson, Randall Merrifield as Dave Moss, Brian Ross as James Lingk, Mary O'Brien Jones as Blake, and Jay Rosenberg as a police officer.


To close the 2013 calendar season, in December MAS staged John Bielenberg's adaptation of A CHRISTMAS CAROL. Before he retired as a college professor of theater, Bielenberg originally created his version, which incorporates traditional seasonal music, for 10 actors for the Cider Mill Playhouse in upstate New York where it has been performed every December since 1979. MAS's production of it is the 4th in Maine, and the company hopes it will become a tradition here. Heading the cast as Scrooge was Brian Ross with Christine West, Jay Rosenberg, Scott Smith, Leah Smith, Katie Glessner, Erik

Perkins, Tyler Johnstone, Macartney Wyatt, Randall Merrifield, and Ada Curry. Jason Bannister directed, Lila Nation was music director, set and costumes were by John and Elaine Bielenberg, and stage management was by Ginny Ford.

Encouraged by the success of their offerings of the last couple of years, MAS Artistic Director Bannister has scheduled an ambitious year-long season of six productions for 2014, funded by grants from the Basil Burwell Foundation and The Maine Theater Fund. First will be ALL IN THE TIMING by David Ives (for ages 14 and up) running February 7, 8, 14 & 15 at 7 pm and February 9 & 16 at 2 pm at The Playhouse, 107 Church Street in Belfast. Greg Marsanskis directs this evening of one-act comedies. In the cast playing multiple roles are Jason Bannister, James Clayton, Shelly Curtain, Angela Domenichelli, Dennis Harrington, Ivy Lobato, Valerie Philbrick, Nicole Provonsil, and Jim Tatgenhorst. The rest of the season will follow with the Pulitzer Prize and Tony Award winning AUGUST: OSAGE COUNTY by Tracy Letts about that darkly comic dysfunctional Weston family in Oklahoma May 30 – June 8 at Troy Howard School; NUNSENSE, the first in Dan Goggin's musicals about the Little Sisters of Hoboken Aug. 1 – 10 at Belfast UU Church; Neil Simon's PLAZA SUITE September 12 – 21, directed by Erik Perkins, at Troy Howard; a showcase of new works from Maine playwrights in October at The Playhouse; John Bielenberg's A CHRISTMAS CAROL, directed by J. Bannister, Dec. 5 – 14 at Troy Howard.

Asked how he feels about his fledgling company and its progress, Jason Bannister says, "Midcoast Actors' Studio has been a lot of work, but I can't see myself doing anything else. Watching MAS evolve is exciting. I don't know what the future holds for the theater group, but I'm excited to be along for the ride!"

On behalf of **MeACT** (**Maine Association of Community Theaters**), I would like to invite you to this year's *One-Act Play Festival* on April 12 in Gardiner. [Please see membership and registration information on the Auditions & Opportunities page.]

The annual one-day festival is an opportunity for you to connect with other community theater enthusiasts. While we encourage you to submit a one-act play (or several short one-acts) for the festival, you are welcome to attend even if you don't offer a play submission. Admission for individuals is \$15 per adult/\$12 for seniors or students.

In addition to one-act play performances, we offer two workshops in the morning, a MeACT business meeting for those who desire to become more involved in the organization, a luncheon, and commentary on the performances by a Maine theater professional. In the past, performances have ranged from published one-act plays of varying lengths (10 minutes to an hour) to cuttings or scenes from full-length plays (usually a play that has just been or will be produced in its entirety) to pieces scripted and performed by your fellow Mainers.

In accordance with AACT (American Association of Community Theaters) with whom we are affiliated, we offer participating theaters the opportunity to compete in their two-year one-act play cycle. Because this is the first year of the current cycle, there is competition at the state level if you so choose. While competition has never been a primary focus of MeACT, the opportunity is made available for those so inclined.

I hope you will consider participating in this year's festival in Gardiner. The atmosphere is always convivial and you never know what you will learn or see. Please don't hesitate to ask questions.
