PortFringe will be here for the 7th time June 16 – 23. It was in 2012 that PortFringe joined what has become a world-wide circuit of festivals for fringe-type performers, giving them the opportunity to perform their creations more times, maybe many more times. This year's lineup features more than 35 individual or group artists in more than 125 performances in Portland's Arts District at these venues, all within walking distance: Portland Stage Studio and Storefront (2 stages at 25A Forest Ave.), Bright Star World Dance (108 High St.), SPACE Gallery (538 Congress St.), & 2 stages at Mechanics Hall (519 Congress St.)

Deirdre Fulton McDonough of the PortFringe organizing committee says, "This high-energy celebration of scrappy performing arts, run entirely by volunteers, has grown steadily since its inception. In 2017 it generated \$30,000 in ticket sales, all of which was funneled directly back to the artists. Those artists hail from around Maine and the United States, about half of them local and half now from outside of Maine. This year we have our first international artist, from Canada.

"The lineup includes original plays, experimental works, multimedia performances, dance, comedy, and musical theater. There's a send-up of *Swan Lake* set at a camp in Rangeley;

there's an opera that uses only the words found on the back of product packaging. Shows are all one hour or less, and start times are staggered, encouraging attendees to take in as much of the fun as they can!

"This year we have a special kick-off the week before the Fringe with *Hit The Lights! Theatre Company*, a veteran and much-loved PortFringe participant from New York City, coming to do a limited run of their award-winning show, *Horsetale*."
